

It's Cholarship SEASON!



The GOMSF Metropolis Church Music Ministry, is once again accepting applications for the +Xenia Anton Desby and +Dr. Frank Desby Memorial Church Music Scholarships. Eight scholarships of up to \$500 each may be awarded to qualified candidates who wish to develop their musical and liturgical skills and understanding to serve the Church in their local parishes. Originally established as an organ scholarship, these awards have been expanded to serve the entire scope of church musician in our Metropolis, to include singers, chanters, composers, directors, and accompanists. *Preference will be given to those wishing to study organ*

Since 2020, our scholarships have enabled dozens of church musicians to gain the preparation needed to serve their local parishes, strengthening the music programs across the Metropolis.

Church musicians of all ages are encouraged to apply for this great opportunity!


The application and recommendation will be due by December 1st.



October is National Church Music Month

In his Exposition *On the Orthodox Faith*, St. John of Damascus proclaims: "...we both know and confess that God is without beginning, without end, eternal and everlasting, uncreated, immutable, unchangeable, simple, non-composite, incorporeal, invisible, impalpable, uncircumscribed, limitless, ungraspable, incognizable, unfathomable, good, just, almighty, the creator of all created things, sovereign over all, overseeing all, exercising foresight over all, having supreme power over all, and judge of all." This defender of the Faith and hymnographer wrote this at a time when the Church was fighting against heresies and iconoclasm. He composed hundreds of hymns, packed with dogmatic theology and we sing them on a regular basis within our Liturgical cycle. Our church musicians have a *dedicated responsibility* to clearly sing and lead the people in worship proclaiming what we believe, being careful to not muddle words or mis-pronounce in Greek (for those of us not familiar with the language).

It is for this important work that each year, on the first Sunday in October or during the month of October, parishes across the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America

celebrate **National Church Music Sunday**, which began in 1982. This is a day we set aside particularly to honor the contributions of local church music ministry, both the musicians and the music educators who serve their churches through the hymnology of our Orthodox Church. In addition, it is also a day when we recognize the work of the Metropolis Music Ministry as well as the National Forum of Greek Orthodox Church Musicians, who strive to enhance the development of church choirs, church musicians, and liturgical music at metropolis and archdiocesan levels.

Please recognize the contributions of church musicians this year on Sunday, October 5th or another Sunday in October. You can honor your parish church musicians by thanking them for their service to the parish. You can support the Metropolis Music Ministry by donating to the Scholarship fund, and you can support the national church ministry, the work of the National Forum of Greek Orthodox Church Musicians by becoming a steward of the National Forum and contributing to its Annual Church Music Fund Drive held during October. Please remember to stop and thank your church musicians for their service, pray for them, and encourage them to continue to grow in their understanding of the Liturgical Arts and the Faith which they help proclaim.
